Jonah 3:1-5, 10 1 Cor 7:29-31 Mark 1:14-20

Readings Next Weekend:

Deut 18:15-20 1 Cor 7:32-35 Mark 1:21-28



Today's readings give us some Disciplines of Discipleship. First of all, it is to be undefiant. Jonah is told by God to go to Nineveh and call them to conversion. But Jonah rebels and runs in the opposite direction. God has to draw Jonah to obedience. True disciples obey what God tells them to do. Secondly, our discipleship is to be unfettered. The second reading tells us that time is running short, that we should "buy as not owning and...to use as not using the world fully." Too often we are entangled in affairs of the world which increasingly demands all of our time, attention and resources. We are advised to detach and travel light, to be unfettered. Finally, we are advised to be unhesitant. When the Lord calls disciples in today's gospel they "immediately" leave their nets and businesses and follow him. Obviously such a radical move is not possible unless one is unfettered. Discipleship can be a radical call that makes big demands upon us. Without freedom we cannot answer.

DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE LEGAL PROTECTION OF UNBORN CHILDREN: The over 56 million abortions since the 1973 decisions of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton reflect with heartbreaking magnitude what Pope Francis means by a "throwaway culture." However, we have great trust in God's providence. We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord's help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard. January 22nd is designated as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn **Children**. "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22nd shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion." As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms on that date. and important intention.
