Many Christians have memorized the 23rd Psalm and joyfully recite it. Most consider its words deeply consoling and reassuring. Certainly this is true. But the 23rd Psalm is also a Psalm of Confession. In effect we are saying that since the Lord is my shepherd I follow only him and not another shepherd. Jesus declares in the Gospel today that his sheep follow him and that they will not follow the voice of another shepherd. In fact they will run from a false shepherd who they do not recognize! Are we like this? Are we as smart as sheep? Too often we not only fail to flee false shepherds we run after them and cling to them. We expose ourselves to all sorts of morally dangerous influences and enjoy the diversions and deviations of the world. If the Lord really is our Shepherd we will listen only to him, judge all other voices against his and run guickly from any voice that is not his. Is the Lord truly your Shepherd or just one voice among many that you heed?
