THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

The title of today's feast is The Exaltation of the Holy Cross. To exalt something is to lift it up. Jesus said, "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must he Son of Man be lifted up (on the cross). To look upon the bronze serpent healed the ancient Israelites. For us too, in a far better way, to look upon the Christ on the cross is to be healed. How are we healed? The answer is that there is something healing in facing what we have done. Look upon the cross and see what our sins have done. Every sin we commit increased Jesus' agony. Sin causes a very ugly reality. My selfishness is the spittle on his face. My cruelty is the lashes on his back. My abuse of others is the nails in his wrists, my sins of pride the crown of thorns. Look at sin and see its ugly reality. It masquerades as "Freedom" and doing what feels good but it is ugly and cruel. To see this and accept it is to experience a first step in our healing. Look again at the cross. Now see how much God loves you. God loves the world so much that he gave us his only Son. Allow this love to reach you and transform you. Allow this love to heal you. Look to the Cross, it heals you.
