Today's Gospel gives an important reminder to compare ourselves to others is to completely miss the point of our spiritual journey, which is to become more like Christ in the way he intends for us personally. Notice first the Presentation of the Problem. The text says, Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else. The text makes it clear that the problem is two-fold. First, we cannot have our own righteousness, and even if we could it would never be adequate. We need to have Jesus' righteousness. Secondly, the problem is that some look down on everyone else because they don't understand their own poverty and need for mercy. Next, notice the Portrayal of the Problem. The arrogant man compares himself favorably to a man he considers worse than him. The problem with this is that other people are not the standard I have to meet. Jesus is. I will not get to heaven by being better than some poor sinner. I will only get there by becoming Christ. Get it? Now we know why we need mercy! Finally, note the Prescription for the Problem. The sinful man reflected only on his need for mercy and humbled himself before God. This man went away with the righteousness of Jesus, for he was smart enough to ask for it.
