The Gospel today presents four principles of productive discipleship. The first is the Principle of Pain, for the Lord describes the necessity of pruning in life, as he describes our life as branches on the vine. We do not like the experience of pruning at all. But, as any experienced gardener knows, pruning is an essential part of long-living things such as roses, shrubs, trees, and so forth. The Lord will not leave us unpruned, lest we grow wild and have our strength dissipated. Next, there is the Principle of Persistence. Notice that the word "abide" or "remain" occurs seven times in this brief passage. To abide means to go on habitually residing close to the Lord, and to be stable and steadfast, fixed and firm, consistent and connected in this residing. Too many Christians are on-again, off again in their relationship with the Lord. The Lord invites us and gives us the grace to abide with him. Next, note the Principle of Peril. The Lord warns that those who do not abide have their strength wither, their faith also becomes dry. He further warns that "people will gather them and throw them into a fire." In a way, the warning is that if I do not know who I am, anyone can name me. If I do not believe in God I may well fall into the trap of believing anything. Disconnected from Christ, people can easily carry me off and I am easily burned. Finally, note the Principle of Produce. In effect, if we remain on the vine we produce abundant fruit. Why? Because, as Jesus describes it, the Father can trust us with greater and greater blessings since the Word, the mind of Christ, is within us. Thus, the Father knows we will use our blessings well and ask for what is right.
