The well known Beatitudes in the Gospel today should be seen as a portrait more than a prescription. In effect, Jesus is painting a picture of what a transformed human person looks like. It is not possible for us to simply do all these things under our own unaided flesh power. We may make a little progress but in the end we will tend to slide back in what the flesh wants to be: selfish, rich in what this world offers, and quite well liked by the world. Only with grace is it possible to become truly poor in spirit. Specifically, to prefer God to the things of this world that we stop acquiring endlessly and live more simply and with austerity. The flesh does not what to do this. The flesh wants to acquire, to be abundant with the world's blessings and good favor. Only grace can make us prefer God to what this world offers and to be willing to be hated and persecuted by this world. The more we are transformed by God's grace, the less we resemble the world and the more we resemble the picture that Jesus paints today.
