*Message from the Pastor*

Today's Gospel features the rather familiar story of Zacchaeus who climbs a tree to see Jesus. We can look at this Gospel in three stages. First, there is the **Shortsighted Sinner**. And this is Zacchaeus (and us). To call Zacchaeus short is not simply a reference to his physical stature it is a reference to his moral state. He is deficient in righteousness. He does not measure up. He cannot see the Lord until he climbs a tree (the tree is the cross). Next, notice the **Searching Savior**. This is Jesus. It is true that Zacchaeus was looking for Jesus but an even more joyful fact is that Jesus was looking for Zacchaeus. He saw him in that tree and asked him to come down. He sought his company and a meal with him. Jesus has done this for us today as well for he has called us to receive of his body and blood in this sacred and sacrificial meal of the Mass. Finally, notice the **Saving Surrender**. Zacchaeus is moved by the Lord's love and invitation. He repents of his sin and promises to restore what he has stolen and to give half of everything else to the poor. It is true that ultimately Zacchaeus must surrender all to Jesus (not just half), but we have a start here and the Lord will get him (and us) to the full surrender in due time. But, to make a long story short, Zacchaeus has come to Jesus and Jesus will draw him to the full stature of Christ (cf Eph 4:13) in due time.



**REMINDER:** Sun., Nov. 6<sup>th</sup>, Daylight Saving Time will end. Remember to turn your clocks **BACK one hour** before going to bed next Saturday.



**FEAST OF ALL SAINTS** is **TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 1<sup>st</sup>**. It is a Holy Day of Obligation in which Catholics should attend Mass. While the Church acknowledges many saints by name, there are countless others known to God who are with him in glory and make up the "Cloud of Witnesses" who surround us (cf Heb 12:1). It is these saints in particular who are celebrated on All Saints Day. Mass will be celebrated at HCSC at **7:00am, 10:00am and 7:00pm**. All are welcome.

**FEAST OF ALL SOULS: NOVEMBER 2<sup>nd</sup>** is the day the Church has set aside to commemorate deceased family members and friends who await their purification in Purgatory. While these departed souls can pray for us, they can no longer pray for themselves. Parishioners are encouraged to visit the Catholic Cemeteries of the Archdiocese of Washington, **Wed., Nov. 2<sup>nd</sup>**, to pray for all souls awaiting the resurrection of their bodies in Christ. Mass is held in cemetery chapels of: Gate of Heaven (9:00am); Mt. Olivet (9:30am); and Resurrection (9:00am). Visit [www.ccaw.org](http://www.ccaw.org) or call cemetery management.



**PRAYERS FOR THE DEAD:** One of the spiritual works of mercy is to pray for the dead. November is the Church's traditional month to pray for

our deceased friends and family. Mass will be celebrated every other day for the *Poor Souls*. **To include your relatives and friends**, list their names on the All Souls Day envelope (included with tithing envelopes or in the rear of the church) and drop in the collection basket or the rectory office. A donation is not needed to submit names but is appreciated. # HOW SHOULD CATHOLICS UNDERSTAND AND CELEBRATE HALLOWEEN?

How should we as Catholics and Christians respond to Halloween? In recent decades there seems to have been the emergence of two views. Some see Halloween as generally harmless fun. While others see Halloween as an often dangerous alliance with the occult, the demonic and evil.

**Those who see it as harmless fun** are probably older and remember a more “innocent time,” at least for kids. Back when I was a kid in the 1960s and early 1970s we would sometimes dress in ghoulish costumes and attempt to look as frightening as possible. One year I went about as a skeleton. Another year I was a zombie. Another year a ruthless pirate. There were a few years where I dressed more mildly as an astronaut and a Navy officer. But it was all good fun. Even in the ghoulish costumes it never occurred to me that the “dark side” was attractive or that devil worship would ever be in my future. All this dressing up stuff was not in admiration of bad stuff it was about being goofy and making all the devilish stuff seem silly.

**For others who see Halloween as dangerous and harmful**, there are surely concerns today about Halloween. It is true that there are increasing numbers of people who take the evil, dark and demonic seriously. There is a rise in Satanism today and for many satanic groups and covens it is

time for the “celebration” of what is dark and evil.

Many exorcists warn that this view of Halloween is a sadly “fruitful” night for satanic groups to lure weak Christians and non-believers to their ways. In addition to this, some adult costumes at adult parties



throughout the city and other places have become immoral and disrespectful.

Perhaps the best approach to Halloween is to resist the modern trends that have turned it into a day focused on demons and reclaim the Halloween that was, and still is, an expression of Christian faith.

**Indeed, the word "Halloween" is derived from Catholic faith and tradition.** All Saints Day which occurs on November 1<sup>st</sup>, the day after Halloween, was called, in older English, the “een of all Hallows.” The word “een” means “evening.” And, “all Hallows” means, “all Saints.” So,

again, “Halloween” means “The evening of all Hallows.”

To put it in liturgical terms, Halloween is the Vigil of the Feast of All Saints. Vigils take place the evening before a great feast. For example, Christmas Eve is the vigil Mass before December 25<sup>th</sup> which is Christmas Day. All Saints, like Christmas is also a great feast day, and so, the celebration begins at sundown the day before November 1<sup>st</sup>, which is October 31<sup>st</sup>. So, Halloween has always been our holy day, even if the world turned it into a rather secular celebration.

**The Church celebrates the feast of All Saints to counter certain pagan notions** that the dead who walked the earth were fearsome and often brought us harm. The Church’s answer was that the dead were not ghouls and zombies. They were in God’s care. Some, judged worthy of heaven but still in need of purification were in purgatory. Others among the dead were the saints in heaven who were purified, glorious and holy. Even the souls in hell were detained there and not able to cause us any serious harm. And although the scary traditions have developed and continue, the Church has largely succeeded in pushing back the fears about the dead among the faithful. Indeed, death itself is not to be feared. Christ has conquered death and made it a way into heaven and unto glory for those who love God.

Even the graveyards, corpses, blood, skeletons, and coffins of Halloween that some put in their yards can be seen as a way of confronting, on a yearly basis, our mortality and our often repressed fear of death. The victory of Christ and the Feasts of All Saints actually gives us a basis to do this. Many of our brothers and sisters who have gone before us through the portal of death are now glorified in heaven and experience joys unspeakable and glories untold!

*Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting? The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ (1 Cor 15:54-56).*



Regarding the evil spirits and demons that some sadly celebrate or focus on, another Scripture comes to mind,

*And having disarmed the powers and principalities [of evil], Christ made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross. (Col 2:15)*

Like Christ and only because of his triumph we too can make a kind of spectacle of them. And here too we confront some of our natural fears about evil and things related to it: monsters, bats, owls, ghosts and goblins. The world can be a scary place, strange and mysterious place. Halloween, allows us (especially children) to roam a night said to be filled with frightening things, only to find friends and neighbors and candy!



Again, vague fears are collectively confronted and processed and we take courage in the fact that Christ has conquered.

It is true that some in the secular world have demonized Halloween by focusing on the dark and evil and forgetting that this has been conquered by Christ our Light. For Christians, a better strategy might be to emphasize the Feast Day of All Saints to which Halloween points. Costumes that feature Saints and biblical figures can be a great to teach children and evangelize neighbors who offer candy and other treats. Perhaps too, the children can say, "Thank you and May God bless you!" as they depart from the door. In so doing we can put the "Hallow" (holy saints) back in Halloween!


