The Gospel today presents some Practical Principles of Prophecy as we focus on the ministry of John the Baptist. Note first, the Portrait of Proper Prophecy. Note the Content of John's preaching: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" Here is a

balance to get right. The preacher and the prophet must speak frankly of sin but also of the grace available to conquer that sin. Hence, John the Baptist is willing and able to declare the reality of sin and the necessity of repenting from it. But he is also able to declare the availability of the Kingdom wherein one is able to find the grace to overcome sin. Too many preachers lack this balance. In the past it was all fire and brimstone. Today it is too often, the steady diet of "God is love" with little reference to the need to repent. Next, note the Product of Powerful Prophecy. The text describes how many came to John repenting of their sins. The truest measure of success in preaching is a long line for the confessional. Next, note the **Purity of Powerful Prophecy.** The text shows that John the Baptist had no fear of people's opinion and would not compromise the message based on his audience. All the credentials of the temple leaders did not impress him. Neither did the status of the Jews as the chosen people cause him to soften his message. Finally, note the Person of Powerful Prophecy. When his audience wants to know more about him, John talks instead about Jesus. That's the message, "Jesus, not me."



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During this season of Advent, we want to share our 'Gifts of the Spirit' with those who are experiencing challenges related to pregnancy, within our parish and surrounding community. As we celebrate the gift of life and pray for an end to abortion, we must realize our obligation to support our local Crisis Pregnancy Centers and other resources that provide assistance to those women and families who face a challenging pregnancy. Our *Advent Tree* is located in front of the St. Joseph's altar with purple paper bulbs hanging from the limbs. We prayerfully ask you to remove a tag, decide on a monetary amount and then make the donation (cash, check or electronically) at your convenience. We ask you to submit your donation no later then January 1, 2023. Here are the ways to donate:

- 1. **CASH**—submit cash in an envelope and indicate ADVENT TREE (include name if you want donation to appear in your annual statement). Ask an usher for an envelope.
- 2. **CHECK**—make check payable to HCSC and write ADVENT TREE in memo.
- 3. **FAITH DIRECT** make a <u>one-time</u> gift (direct debit or credit card) by scanning the QR code  $\rightarrow$  <u>or</u> **TEXT** 'Advent Tree' to 301-478-8900. This is a FREE service.
- 4. **PAYPAL**—make a one-time gift by scanning the QR code → and make a notation of 'Advent Tree' in your notes (if an option). This is a FREE service.

**NOTE:** All donations made by cash or check can be dropped in collection basket during Mass or brought to rectory office.

**The Capitol Hill Pregnancy Center** is a 501(c)3 organization dedicated to supporting women and men facing a crisis pregnancy through the provision of services, supplies and counseling. 
