

In today's Gospel we hear the "Beatitudes" ... "Blessed are the poor in spirit the reign of God is theirs ..." and so forth. Now the word, "Blessed" or the word "Beatitude" deserves a little attention. The Greek word which is used throughout the beatitudes which we commonly translate "blessed" is makariois which also translates as "happy."

But it is not just an emotional or passing happiness. It is an enduring happiness. It is a happiness independent of conditions. One can be in this state of happiness even in the midst of great struggle and hardship. Now, this understanding of the Greek word as a kind of serene and enduring happiness helps us to understand that the beatitudes are in many ways very topsy-turvy, very paradoxical. Happy are those who mourn? Happy are those persecuted for holiness' sake? Happy are the insulted and slandered for the sake of Christ? It all seems a little strange. And yet, that is precisely the point. Our happiness is not rooted in the passing values and norms of the world. The happiness of the world comes and goes. But our true happiness is rooted in doing God's will, in experiencing His life in us. That is why the martyrs could go to their deaths praising the Lord and in great happiness. So, viewed with the eyes of faith, these beatitudes are not topsy-turvy at all. In fact, they make great sense. And we only have to experience them one by one to know that.






