Today's Gospel teaches us some important things about facing the trials of life. First, note the PLACE of this gospel. Jesus, along with Peter, James and John go up a high mountain. This was no hill. It was a mountain. Have you ever climbed a mountain or do you appreciate the

difficulty of it? Once up this mountain they will have a great experience of glory but the climb has to come first. And so too for us. Most of the best things in our life come at the high price of long hard work. Next, notice the PRESCRIPTION of this Gospel. Once upon the mountain they get a glimpse of glory. And Peter declares that it is good to be here! He is right. Jesus arranged for this glimpse of glory to prepare them for the difficult days ahead and he does not want them to forget this wonderful moment. We too ought to savor the good things in our life for they are the balance to the crosses and challenges of life. Next, notice the PRODUCT of this gospel. The Lord intends for this experience to remind them all that heaven is more than worth the cross. So too for us, the Lord intends us to meditate frequently on heaven in such a way that we are encouraged to accept the struggle in order to get there.



Therese Wilson Favors

Therese Wilson Favors is the former Director of the Office of African American Catholic Ministries for the Archdiocese of Baltimore, having served in that role for nineteen (19) years. At the moment of her retirement, Ms. Favors had accumulated 43 years of service in ministry within the

Archdiocese of Baltimore. She has served as both Program Director and Executive Director of the National Black Catholic Congress, Director of Evangelization at Corpus Christi Catholic Church and Coordinator of Elementary Catechesis for the Archdiocese of Baltimore. Her ministry also extended to over five (5) years as a Catholic School teacher at both St. Cecilia and Fr. Charles A. Hall Schools.

She is a Professor at the Institute for Black Catholic Studies at Xavier University in New Orleans and Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles. Mrs. Favors lectures throughout the country and prepares programs that focus on African-American issues surrounding catechesis, evangelization, and spirituality. Along with many Black Catholic leaders in Baltimore, Therese launched a campaign of street evangelization titled, "Operation Faith Lift" in year 2000. She has contributed to several books, serving as editor for "What We Have Seen and Heard: Essays and Stories of Black Catholics in Baltimore," published in 2006, twenty (20) issues of "Keep On Teaching," an Africentric catechetical resource and "God Bless Them Who Have Their Own: African American Catechetical Camp Meetin' Proceedings" (United States Catholic Conference of Bishops).

Additionally she has been a contributing writer for resources discussing HIV and AIDS, as well as the National Day of Prayer for African American and African Families. Mrs. Favors is the author of "Rise Up and Re-Build" a resource for African American Families issued by the National Black Catholic Congress. In 2007, she was awarded the Papal Honor of Pro Ecclesia Et Pontifice by Pope Benedict XVI.

For 34 years, Therese has been married to Andrew Favors who is a tremendous blessing; lending enormous support and love. Ms. Favors holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Coppin State University and a Master's Degree in Religious Education from St. Mary's Seminary, both of Baltimore, Maryland.




