The Gospel today offers five teachings on Christian Discipleship. First, the AVAILABILITY of Christian Discipleship. The workers who are

PASTOR hired are day laborers. As such they are well acquainted with the "rough side of the mountain" and face each day with uncertainty, "Will I be hired and eat, or not?" But it is their emptiness that makes them available, their hunger that keeps them ready for work. So too for us who often find that it is our concerns that keep us close to the Lord. Second, the CALL of Christian Discipleship. The workers cannot go into the vineyard until they are called. And, so too for us. We must wait for the Lord's direction before launching out in all sorts of ways. Third, there is the TIMING of Christian Discipleship. The workers were sent into the vinevard at different times each day. We may have any number of good ideas, but the Lord says, "Not yet." Sometimes too he says, yes, now. Other times he puts things on us for which we may not feel ready, but he says "now." Here too, we ask for the grace to accept the Lord's timing in our life. Fourth, we see the **PERSEVERANCE** of Christian Discipleship. Some were not hired until late in the day. But notice, they were still there to be hired. And so must we often wait for the Lord and be able to be found ready when he calls. Fifth, there is the **GIFT** of Christian Discipleship. Note how the early workers claimed it was unfair that they were paid the same as others who worked less. But this is our failure to understand that discipleship is a gift, and the earlier you get the gift the better. Being a Christian and a disciple is not a burden to be delayed as long as possible. It is a delight to be sought after.


voices in praise and song with a FREE concert! A free-will offering will be taken at the concert. Our youth choir will also be featured. Invite your family and friends!
