



Jesus Christ is the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead and ruler of the kings of the earth. To Him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his Blood, who has made us into a Kingdom, priests for His God and Father, to him be glory and power forever and ever. Amen. Behold, He is coming amid the clouds, and every eye will see Him, even those who pierced Him. All the peoples of the

earth will lament Him. Amen. "I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, "The one who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty." Rev (1:5-8). #### EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

March 2024

Dear Parishioners,

Early on a Sunday morning many centuries ago, Christ Jesus walked out of the tomb that the world had assigned to him and went to encounter the disciples he loved. It is still the case today. Jesus encounters us in every Mass, in every Sacrament, and in every gathering of the faithful. This ongoing experience of the presence of the risen Lord is so essential to our well-being and to a proper vision for our life.

Most essentially, we must realize that the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord is not an event locked in ancient history. It is an event, ever-present and which "reaches through" time to touch and empower us. St. Paul speaks to the on-going and ever-present quality of Jesus' Death and Resurrection (also called the "Paschal Mystery") when he says, We are always carrying the death of Jesus in our body, so that the life of Jesus will also be manifested in our body. (2 Cor 4:10). So, notice, he says we are always experiencing this paschal mystery. It is on-going, it is our very life.



What this means is that our sufferings and even our eventual death are holy and a source of life and purification for us. This is because they are joined to Christ's own suffering and death, which brought us salvation and the glory of heaven! And in Jesus' Resurrection, we rise with him to new, abundant and everlasting life. Even now these graces touch us and every day we experience dying to the world but also, if we are faithful, we experience resurrection in a new, purified and more abundant life.

In this Year of the Eucharist, we have reflected especially how the Holy Mass is the most profound way that the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus are made present to us and how their graces are applied to us. In every Mass the power of the Cross reaches across time and touches us with its power to put sin to death and bring graces alive. The Risen Christ is Himself the true celebrant of every Mass working through the human priest who is celebrant. Jesus greets us, walks our aisle, teaches us his Word, and gives us his Body and Blood. He applies the healing power of the paschal mystery to us in every Mass. Hence there is no other place where you should want to be. Don't block your blessings! Don't miss a single Sunday Mass you can possibly attend. Jesus is here right now.

This Easter, I want you to know of my love for you. Every one of you is precious to God and He has put that same love in my heart for you. You have often heard me say how I treasure the relationship we have had over the many years as a parish family. Without you I would not be the priest and disciple I am today. Christ Jesus has worked through you, and you have taught me much and brought forth joy and confidence in me. So many of you have manifested a strong and enduring faith even in the midst of social injustices and persecutions past and present, and the sad tragedy of scandals in the very Church you love. Yet, in all of this you still find Christ in the Church and in the Sacraments. In all the setbacks and sorrows you have chosen to rise with Christ and declare, "Trouble don't last always." We need always to remind each other of resurrection glory. I am grateful for your witness and testimony to me. Blessed Easter!

Altar Guild: Devoted to the care and cleaning of the sacred vessels and coordinates the liturgical supplies.

Servers: Youth who assist clergy and congregation in Liturgical celebrations.

Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist: Assists at Mass by distributing both species of Communion. Also, assist priests and deacons in serving the needs of the elderly, sick and homebound community.

Faith Formation/Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.): Provides catechetical teachings for new parishioners who are becoming Catholic or need further education of the faith.

Holy Name Society: A spiritual group of lay men dedicated to the praise and respect of the most Holy Name of God. Members are challenged to become models of hope, and make present in each individual their unique revelation of Christ as he continues his spiritual journey towards Christian manhood.

Knights of Columbus: Catholic men and their families dedicated and caring about; serving the church, community, country, and fellowman-working together for a better tomorrow.

Ladies of Charity: provides services to our parishioners/neighbors in need of food/clothing and other needs.

Sodality: Promotes a greater devotion to Our Lord through veneration of His Blessed Mother, and to provide a medium through which Sodalists may experience a deeper and more intimate relationship with God in their daily lives.

Sound & Recording Ministry: Set up/conduct sound mixing and recording and equipment prior to Sunday Mass, and special services when requested.


Ushers/Ministers of Hospitality (Adult & Youth): Greets parishioners and quests and assists them when they enter the church. They also manage the Candlelight Store.




