Ez 17:22-24 2 Cor 5:6-10 Mark 4:26-34

Readings Next Weekend:

Today's readings speak of three insights that disciples must recall. First is ADAPTABILITY. We hear in both the first reading and the Gospel how God can take what is very humble, and PASTOR adapt it to be something mighty and powerful. Perhaps it is the "tender shoot" of the first

reading that becomes a mighty oak. Perhaps it is the mustard seed of the Gospel which becomes a great shade tree. But God adapts us for his purposes and no one should say, 'I cannot be used.' An old song says, "If you can use anything Lord, you can use me." The insight is AWE-ABILITY, the capacity to reverence mystery and to have wonder and awe at what God does. In the Gospel Jesus emphasizes that, though a man plants seeds he does not really know the deeper mysteries of life and growth. Despite our often selfcongratulatory celebration of our sciences, there is much more we do not know or understand. And while science is often good at answering "how" it is not good at answering the more ultimate questions of "why", and of meaning. We do well to maintain a reverential awe of the deeper mysteries of God's works and his ways. This also opens us to hope and to the possibilities that God can work in hidden ways to exult what is humble and to bring great transformation to those who are cast down and troubled, including ourselves and our culture. Finally, there is ACCOUNTABILITY. The second reading reminds us that we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ and render an account. As we have seen, God is able to adapt, and to work in wondrous and hidden ways to lift us up, even if we are humble and struggle. We must one day render an account of how we have responded to God's grace and his invitation to be exulted. On judgment day the expression "I couldn't" will ring hollow, because as we've seen: "God CAN." Today's readings remind us to be open to what God can do, often in mysterious ways.

A Brief History of Juneteenth

In 2021, President Joe Biden signed legislation that made *Juneteenth* a federal holiday in the United States. It is celebrated on June 19th, and the word *Juneteenth* is a portmanteau of "June" and "nineteenth." What follows is a brief presentation of its history and relevance.

Juneteenth has long been celebrated among the African American community and is known as a second "Independence Day". It commemorates the June 19, 1865 announcement of the abolition of slavery in Texas, and more generally the emancipation of African American slaves throughout the Confederate South. Emancipation did not finally come until General Gordon Granger rode into Galveston, Texas and issued General Order No. 3, on June 19th, almost two and a half years after President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863.

The brutal history of slavery and segregation continues to inflict pain on our society, and *Juneteenth* offers a light of hope on the fight for freedom and justice. It is a day that cannot pass without recognizing that it symbolically marks the end of the horrific era of slavery that went on for so long in our nation. But, unfortunately it also highlights the continual existence of hatred and racism that is still present in our world and communities today and the struggle to eliminate it.

As noted by the National Museum of African American History & Culture, *Juneteenth* is a time to celebrate, to gather as a family, to reflect on the past and look to the future. We invite all to celebrate this day as a reminder of the transformative power of human liberation. We encourage all to learn more about this important time in history by spending time with our families to reflect on the meaning of the day. 
