

In today's gospel, the Lord is calling a crucial question. The gospel begins with a kind of Processional and we are told that Jesus is PASTOR beginning a journey through Galilee. What this

means is that he is heading south, into conflict, on his final journey, which will end with his cross, death and resurrection. Jesus' procession is not unlike our own, wherein, as we head toward our eventual death, we must increasingly confront the empty promises of this world, and set our eyes firmly on the kingdom of heaven. But note the Pain. Jesus gives the second prediction of his passion, death and resurrection. Jesus, who knew the torture that awaited him, expresses his pain. Sadly, his Apostles become avoidant, they are afraid to ask him any questions about this, and they seem to draw apart and become engaged in a foolish debate about who's the greatest. So, then comes the **Point**, the crucial, guestion. Jesus asked, "What were you arguing about on the way?" In other words, what is important in your life? What do you spend your time thinking and talking about? Is it really the things of God, or is it foolish and passing things of the world like who's the greatest, who's the big cheese, and how do I rank? Jesus answers their foolishness, (our foolishness), with a shocking paradox: the greatest, in God's eyes, is not those who are served, but those who serve. At the \$10,000 a plate fund raiser. God is not drawn to the head table, or to the dais. He is drawn to those who serve the table. God does not run to the rope line first, he walks into the kitchen and greets the cooks and dishwashers. And so, the crucial question for us is, "What are you discussing as you make your journey, what is important to you?" Is it important to God?

VOTIVE CANDLES: As of Sun., Sept. 29th, the cost for the 7-day votive candle will increase in cost from \$3.50 to \$4. A case of 12 will cost \$40. Vigil candles, often called votive candles, are a form of



burnt offering. A candle is purchased and burnt to the honor of God. It is also true, as you note, that the burning candle beautifully symbolizes our prayer and love for God and our request that he remember our prayers. Votive candles are available in the Candlelight (Usher) Store in the rear of church or the rectory office. You can purchase and light one for the Church or light at home and use with prayer.

The Holy Comforter-Saint Cyprian Church Choir began under the pastoral care of the late Reverend Richard J. Swift, S.S.J., who recognized the need for African-American Catholics to express their musical gifts in Catholic worship. For more than 30 years of its existence, the choir was under the musical leadership of the incomparable Kenneth W. Louis. For the past 8 years, the choir has been under the directorship of George Stewart, who possesses more than *35 years* of excellence.

The HCSC Church Choir's repertoire includes diverse sacred music offerings (anthems, church hymnody, spirituals and traditional as well as gospel music). The members bring over 500 years collectively in singing experience to the ministry. The choir has sung in concert and worship services throughout the Washington, DC, Baltimore metropolitan areas, as well as, toured the south/east coasts and heartland regions of the United States. They have performed with many international artists, served as featured artists in hospitals, churches, government agencies and concert halls. The choir continues their charge to leave no soul untouched, or spirit unchanged, as they lift their hearts and minds in musical ministry.

This October will mark 52 years of ministry, and in keeping with our tradition, we are developing a Souvenir Programme booklet to commemorate the event. The booklet will be PLAYBILL size (5.5"x8.5").
