In today's Gospel we see three Principles for prophets. In speaking of prophets, this means you, for by our baptism we are all summoned to be prophets for the Lord. The first principle is **PROPER PRIORITIES.** The Apostle John, speaking with consternation, indicates that he

and the others tried to prevent someone from driving out a demon in Jesus' name, because the exorcist "was not of our company." This whole action bespeaks confused priorities. Task number one is to advance the Kingdom of God, and take back territory from the evil one. If someone, in Jesus name, is able to drive out demons, we ought to praise the Lord! The enemy of my enemy is my friend. But the Apostles here seem more concerned, about pedigree, personal advancement, power, prestige, and pride. Souls being set free seems a secondary concern to them. Wrong priority! Priority number one: more about Jesus and his Kingdom, less about me and my glory. The second principle **PROPHETS** need **PARTNERSHIP**. The Lord admonishes the apostles, "Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink...will surely not lose his reward." This, of course, implies that the apostles will be needy of help, encouragement, and basic necessities as they undertake to proclaim the gospel. The attitude of wanting to do everything myself, is not only prideful, it is foolish and impossible. We must accept that one of the provisions necessary for those who would be prophets, is the help and support of others. The final principle is **PERCEIVE** the PRIMARY PROBLEM. Through the use of several analogies, the Lord illustrates just how serious sin is, and how essential our need to draw people to salvation. Jesus came to save us from our sins. Our sin is our most serious problem. Jesus says to sin is more serious than to lose our hand, or foot, or eye. It is an essential role of the prophet to help people recognize the absolute need for salvation, and then to draw them to the one who alone can save them. The ancient prophets held up the sins of the people before them and called them to return to the Lord wholeheartedly. How about us?





How to Pray the Rosary

- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross
- Holding the Crucifix, say the "Apostles' Creed"
- 3. On the first bead, say an "Our Father"
- 4. Say three "Hail Marys" on each of the next three beads
- 5. Say the "Glory Be"
- 6. For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery, and then say the "Our Father". While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten "Hail Marys" while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a "Glory Be". and the Fatima Prayer: After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: "O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from



the fires of hell, lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy."

- 7. After saying the five decades, say the "Hail, Holy Queen," followed by this dialogue and prayer:
 - **V**. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. **R.** That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: O God, whose only-begotten Son, by his life, death, and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

Joyful Mysteries: (traditionally said on Mondays and Saturdays, except during Lent)

- 1. The Annunciation (Lk 1:26-38); Trust, Purity, & Humility
- 2. The Visitation (Lk 1:39-80); Service to & Love of Community
- 3. The Nativity (Mt 2:1-12 and Lk 2:1-20); Love of God, Joy, & Peace
- 4. The Presentation in the Temple (Lk 2:22-38); Obedience
- 5. The Finding of the Child Jesus after Three Days in the Temple (Lk 2:41-52); Gift of Understanding, Knowledge, & Wisdom

Luminous Mysteries: (traditionally said on Thursdays, except during Lent)

- 1. The Baptism at the Jordan (Mt 3:13-17; Mk 1:911; Lk 3:21-22 and Jn 1:29-34); Purity
- 2. The Miracle at Cana (Jn 2:1-11); Fidelity
- 3. The Proclamation of the Kingdom and the Call to Conversion (Mt 4:17 and 4:23 -5:12); Sorrow for Sin
- 4. The Transfiguration (Mt 17:1-8; Mk 9:2-8 and Lk 9:28-36); Courage
- 5. The Institution of the Eucharist ((Mt 26:26-29; Mk 14:22-25 and Lk 22:14-20); Love of the Eucharistic Lord & Adoration

Sorrowful Mysteries: (traditionally said on Tuesdays, Fridays; & daily from Ash Wednesday until Easter)

- 1. The Agony in the Garden; (Mt 26:36-50; Mk 14:32-45; & Lk 22:39-48); Prayer, Meditation, & Contemplation
- 2. The Scourging at the Pillar (Jn 19:1); Prudence
- 3. The Crowning of Thorns (Mt 27:27-31; Mk 15:16-20); Honesty
- 4. The Carrying of the Cross (Mt 27:32; Mk 15:21; Lk 2:22-38 and 23:26-31); Patience
- 5. The Crucifixion (Mt 27:33-54; Mk 15:22=39; Lk 23:33-47 and Jn 19:18-37); Final Perseverance

Glorious Mysteries: (traditionally said on Wednesdays except during Lent, & Sundays from Easter to Advent)

- 1. The Resurrection (Mt 28:1-10; Mk 16:1-11; Lk 24:1-12 and Jn 21:1-18); Faith
- 2. The Ascension (Mk 16:19-29; Lk 24:50-51 and Acts 1:6-11); Hope
- 3. The Descent of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:1-4); Fortitude, Courage, & Zeal
- 4. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven (Lk 1:52); Piety
- 5. The Coronation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth (Rev 12:1-5); Honor of Mary




