There is a crucial question that Jesus asks in today's Gospel. Pontius Pilate begins by asking, "Are you a king?" and Jesus responds with the crucial question: "Are you saying this on your own or have others been telling you about me?" This question is

essential for us to answer. It is possible for us who say we believe merely to quote slogans, Bible passages, and things we have heard others say, but to be lacking in our own personal conviction. It's like pulling up to a parking meter and seeing that money is left over in the meter from a previous car. You end up parking on someone else's dime. But at some point it is necessary for us to be able to say on our own that "Jesus is Lord and King." We cannot simply say what others have said. We have to say it and mean it for ourselves. There is an old gospel song that says: "Yes, I know Jesus for myself." Do you? Are you saying this on your own or is it merely that others have been telling you about him?





The Catholic Church in the U.S. recognizes November as Black Catholic History Month to commemorate the rich history and proud heritage of Black Catholics in the United States. We celebrate the contributions that African and African Americans have made and continue to make to our Church. To that end, our parish has provided opportunities to learn and share this whole history and rich heritage of Christian Catholicism. Here is another recommended resource to learn more about Black Catholic history:



History of Black Catholics in the United States by Cyprian Davis. This book (available on Amazon) makes an extremely valuable contribution to our understanding of African American religious life by presenting the first fulllength treatment of the Black Catholic

experience. It is a must read by all interested in this history and culture which is also a part of our own parish's history.

Biblical Basics of the Greatest Story Ever Told



This year, our parish will set our focus on the "Biblical Basics of the Greatest Story Ever Told". The Scriptures teach us why and how we exist, what happened to us in Original Sin and How God, in his great mercy, has redeemed us and called us back to Him in newness of life. This will be a whole-parish catechesis, led by our pastor, in three stages. Words from a keynote song titled Just a Little Talk with Jesus helps us to understand the 3 stages:

- OUR FALL- I once was lost in Sin,
- ii) **OUR REDEPMTION** But Jesus took me in,
- iii) OUR GRACE And then a little Light from Heaven Filled my Soul.
