The liturgical focus of the Feast of the Presentation, which we celebrate today, is light. Christ is our light, and the people who walked in darkness have seen a great



light! In the Gospel, Simeon holds the infant Jesus and calls Him "a light for revelation to

the Gentiles." Thus, this feast has long featured the carrying of candles by the faithful in procession and the blessing of candles. For this reason, the feast was often called Candlemas. Today's feast also celebrates the "purification" of Our Lady. As a Jewish woman, she presented herself forty days after giving birth to be blessed and welcomed back to the community. The Gospel opens with this description: When the days were completed for their purification.... Mary received a blessing from one of the priests of the Temple (Simeon) and they both presented Jesus since every firstborn male is consecrated to the Lord. It might strike us as odd or even irritating that a woman would need to be purified after giving birth. This is not about moral cleansing; it is about ceremonial or ritual cleansing. Ancient Jewish practice exhibited great reverence for the rituals of both birth and death because they are great mysteries. Blessing a woman forty days after birth was a great privilege.

CELEBRATING February is Black History Month in the USA—This month is an annual commemoration of Black Americans' history and celebrated in honor of their contributions to the United States and the world. In

1926, this celebration was founded by Harvard-trained historian Carter G. Woodson and was initially called Negro History Week. During the nation's bicentennial in 1976. President Gerald R. Ford extended the celebration to a month. Throughout the month, our parish will provide resources and other information so that we all may become more aware of the gifts of our multi-cultural community.

The USCCB has also designated Sunday, Feb. 2nd, as **The** National Day of Prayer for the African-American and African Family. This day along with a special prayer was created by Fr. James Goode, OFM in 1989. Through his relationship with Jesus, Father Goode understood in a deep way that Christ's role on earth was to serve as the face of God the Father, drenching us with his mercy. He wanted us all to know that God's mercy endures forever. This National Day of Prayer is a day set aside to give special thanks to God for our families and place our every care in the arms of Jesus. All are welcome to join in unity as one community under God.

Biblical Basics of the Greatest Story Ever Told

This year, our parish will set our focus on the "Biblical Basics of the Greatest Story Ever Told". The Scriptures teach us why and how we exist, what happened to us in Original Sin and How God, in his great mercy, has redeemed us and called us back to Him in newness of life. This will be a whole-parish catechesis, led by our pastor, in three stages. Words from a keynote song titled Just a Little *Talk with Jesus* helps us to understand the 3 stages:

- OUR FALL- I once was lost in Sin,
- ii) OUR REDEPMTION But Jesus took me in,
- iii) OUR GRACE And then a little Light from Heaven Filled my Soul.


GOD OF MERCY AND LOVE

Today we take pause to give God the glory for Family. We pause to take note of the divine beauty of God's creation called Family and we seek God's blessings on our Families. Some say that Family is God's way of giving us a love hug. Generation after generation we have seen God's hug of love manifest itself. It shows that God moves




through and within our human affairs called Family. Family is not only a collection of people... it is a continued journey of a people's connection with God and an expression of the values of that family. In this, we realize that our deepest hopes and dreams are never singular... not just for one person. Rather, they are always connected to others. It is a journey of Us! That is why we pause to pray for our Families and to seek God's blessing and governance over our Family. God is "Our Father".

Here's some spiritual wisdom as we pray for our Family. Always be on the ready to place God in the middle of the Family, especially when serious decisions need to be made. God is our shelter and our strength, always ready to help in times of trouble (Psalm 46:1). Always step back and look at what Jesus would do when relationships among the Family are fragile and weary. Remember that Jesus instituted Christianity as a culture of reconciliation rather than a cancellation of a person or a people. Jesus says that the golden rule of life is Do to others whatever you would have them do to you (Matthew 7:12).

This same strategy of healing is warranted in these times within our land. Wounds are festering and there is a lot of pain out there. Let's look to God's Word and God's Ways to find a healing ointment. In places that are in need of healing...Work towards reconciliation with love, patience and true justice. Do all your work in love (1 Corinthians 16:14) and remember that God never stops working (John 5:17). Let us therefore lean on the Lord, for great is God's faithfulness and His mercies endure forever.


