To rid the worldly environment especially the first way of false maxims, let us recall the Biblical passage: Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect. (Rm. 12:2).

4) Conclude the meditation with the **Litany of Humility**. *Cf. pg.* 125

Sixth Day

Treatise of True Devotion to the Virgin Mary [27-36] Mary's Maternal Influence

Jesus is already in glory at the right hand of the Father. So, is he still the Son of Mary? Saint Louis Marie says yes, because what is natural is elevated by grace. Glory brings grace to perfection. All that was naturally good on this earth is elevated to the supernatural reality. Now, in the glory of God, it is perfect.

"It is true, then, that our Lord, in heaven, is still the **Son of Mary** as He was on earth and maintains the submission and obedience of the most perfect of all children to the best of all mothers."

But it is not a motherhood as we know it: "Mary is infinitely inferior to her Son, who is God. Therefore, when we read in the writings of St. Bernard, St. Bernardine, St. Bonaventure, and others, that in heaven and on earth everything, even God himself, is subject to the Blessed Virgin, it must be understood that the authority that God bestowed upon her is so great that it seems as if she had the same power as God. Her prayers and requests are so powerful with him that he accepts them as commands in the sense that he never resists his dear mother's prayers because it is always humble and conformed to his will."

Mary is a sign of true faith

God the Father wants to engender children through Mary until the end of the world: "Just as in the natural and bodily generation there is a father and a mother, so in the supernatural and spiritual generation there is a father, who is God, and a Mother, who is Mary. All true children of God have God for their Father and Mary for their Mother."

Catholics "who do not have Mary as their Mother, do not have God for their Father either," affirms Saint Louis Marie, echoing an affirmation of Saint Cyprian. But it is not enough to say that Mary is mother if there is no filial love. "If they had her for their mother they would love and honor her as good and true children naturally love and honor the mother who gave him life. An infallible and unmistakable sign by which we can distinguish a heretic, a man of false doctrine, an enemy of God, from one of God's true friends, is that the heretic and the hardened sinner show nothing but contempt and indifference for our Lady."

Mary is Mother of the Church

"God the Son wants to be formed, and so to speak, to be incarnate each day through his beloved Mother, in his members." In the Mystical Body of the Church, where Christ is the head and we are the members, "Mary is the neck that unites the Head with the members."

"One and the same mother does not give birth to the head without the members nor to the members without the head, for these would be monsters in the order of nature. In the same way, in the order of grace, the Head and the members are born of the same mother. If a member of the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, that is to say, a predestined one, were born of a Mother other than Mary who gave birth to the Head, he would not be an heir of Heaven, nor a member of Jesus Christ, but a monster in the order of the grace."

Mary is a figure of the Church

"When Mary has taken root in a soul, she produces in it wonders of grace which only she can produce; for she alone is the fruitful Virgin, who never had and never will have her equal in purity and fruitfulness. Together with the Holy Spirit Mary produced the greatest thing that ever was or ever will be: the God-man. Consequently, she will also perform the greatest marvels which will be seen in the latter times. The formation and education of the great saints, who will come at the end of the world, are reserved for her, for only this singular and miraculous Virgin can produce, in union with the Holy Spirit, singular and extraordinary things."

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Meditation

- 1) Place yourself in the presence of God.
- 2) Ask for the grace of having a great desire to be pleasing in the eyes of the Lord, and to have eternal life as the only goal of my most important choices, without letting myself be seduced by the spirit of the world.
- 3) Read the text below and then take time to reflect on it. (From Antonio Royo Marín, Theology of Christian Perfection) What is the "worldly environment"?

The second way the *worldly spirit* is characterized is by ridicule and persecution against what the Christian loves. In particular, the world mocks and persecutes the life of piety and decent, modest clothing. Moral events, which elevate the spirit, are defined as ridiculous and boring. They are the object of mockery. The world considers the holy laws of marriage obsolete and impossible to practice.

If we must suffer ridicule, let us remember the Lord, and offer to accompany him in his Passion: Then the soldiers of the procurator took Jesus inside the Praetorium and gathered the whole

cohort around him. They stripped him and put a purple cloak over him and, braiding a crown of thorns, put it on his head and a cane in his right hand. Then they bent the knee in front of him, and made fun of him saying: 'Hail, King of the Jews!' and they spit on him and took a cane to hit him on the head. And after having mocked him, they took off his mantle, put his clothes on him and took him to crucify him. (Mt 27:27-31)

4) Conclude the meditation with the Litany of Humility. Cf. pg. 125

Seventh Day

Treatise of True Devotion to the Virgin Mary [37-48]

Mary is Queen of Hearts

After everything that has been said previously, Saint Louis, **concludes** in this way:

a. "Mary could not be the mother of all men if she had no right and control over their souls by a singular grace of the Most High, who, having given her power over his own Son, has also given it to his own adopted children, not only as for the body—which would be of little account—but also in what concerns their soul."

b. "Mary is the Queen of hearts because, just as the kingdom of Jesus Christ consists mainly of hearts, so the kingdom of the Blessed Virgin is mainly within man, that is, in his soul. In fact, it is above all in the souls where she is glorified together with the Son, more than in all the visible creatures. So we may call her, as the saints do, Queen of all hearts."

Mary is necessary to men

If God willingly wanted the Virgin to be necessary, how much more is it necessary for men to reach the ultimate goal! Many scholars, in reference to the irrefutable proofs given by the Holy Fathers, such as St. Augustine, St. Bernard, St.
