cohort around him. They stripped him and put a purple cloak over him and, braiding a crown of thorns, put it on his head and a cane in his right hand. Then they bent the knee in front of him, and made fun of him saying: 'Hail, King of the Jews!' and they spit on him and took a cane to hit him on the head. And after having mocked him, they took off his mantle, put his clothes on him and took him to crucify him. (Mt 27:27-31)

Seventh Day

Treatise of True Devotion to the Virgin Mary [37-48]

Mary is Queen of Hearts

After everything that has been said previously, Saint Louis, **concludes** in this way:

a. "Mary could not be the mother of all men if she had no right and control over their souls by a singular grace of the Most High, who, having given her power over his own Son, has also given it to his own adopted children, not only as for the body—which would be of little account—but also in what concerns their soul."

b. "Mary is the Queen of hearts because, just as the kingdom of Jesus Christ consists mainly of hearts, so the kingdom of the Blessed Virgin is mainly within man, that is, in his soul. In fact, it is above all in the souls where she is glorified together with the Son, more than in all the visible creatures. So we may call her, as the saints do, Queen of all hearts."

Mary is necessary to men

If God willingly wanted the Virgin to be necessary, how much more is it necessary for men to reach the ultimate goal! Many scholars, in reference to the irrefutable proofs given by the Holy Fathers, such as St. Augustine, St. Bernard, St. Thomas and St. Bonaventure, have shown that devotion to Mary is necessary to save oneself. "Even according to Oecolampadius and other heretics, lack of esteem and love for the Virgin Mary is an infallible sign of God's disapproval. On the other hand, to be entirely and genuinely devoted to her is a sure sign of God's approval." (TD 40)

To emphasis this, Saint Louis de Montfort quotes Saint John Damascene: "Devotion to you, O Blessed Virgin, is a means of salvation which God gives to those whom he wishes to save."

The saint continues to affirm that from century to century the people who strive the most to grow in union with God will be the most diligent in praying to the Blessed Virgin and in having her always present as a model to imitate and to call upon for help. All of this will happen, in a particular way, at the end of the world, because the Most High and his Blessed Mother form great saints who will surpass in sanctity the majority of the other saints. These great souls, filled with grace and zeal, will have a particular devotion to the Blessed Virgin, will be chosen by God to oppose their enemies who are raging on all sides. With one hand they give battle, overthrowing and crushing the heretics and with their heresies, the schismatics and their schisms, idolaters and their idolatries, the sinners and their wickedness. With the other hand they will build the temple of the true Solomon and the mystical city of God, namely, the Blessed Virgin, who is called the Fathers of the Church the Temple of Solomon and the City of God. By word and example they will draw all men to true devotion to Mary. This will make many enemies, but also many victories and much glory to God alone.

Meditation

- 1) Place yourself in the presence of God.
- 2) Ask for the grace of having a *great desire* to be pleasing in the eyes of the Lord, and to have eternal life as the only goal of my most important choices, without letting myself be seduced by the spirit of the world.
- 3) Read the text below and then spend take time to reflect on it.

What is the "worldly environment"? (From Antonio Royo Marín, Theology of Christian Perfection).

In the third place, the worldly spirit is in those who give priority to pleasures and diversions, increasingly further in immorality: theaters, movies, dances, centers of perversion, beaches, pools with promiscuity of sexes; newspapers, magazines, romances, indecent fashions, careless conversations, provocative stories, double-meaning phrases, etc. Those who do not think or live but only for pleasure and fun, which often sacrifices everything else, even indispensable costs for the most urgent needs of life.

If then you have risen with Christ, **seek the things above**, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and **your life is hidden with Christ in God**. When Christ who is our life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory. Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desires and covertousness, which is idolatry; things for which the wrath of God comes upon the children of disobedience, in which you also walked in another time when you lived in them. **But now put them away**: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and foul talk from your mouth. Supporting one another, and forgiving one

another if one has a complaint against another. As Christ forgave you, so you also do. (Col 3:1-8, 13).

4) Conclude the meditation with the **Litany of Humility**. *Cf. pg.* 125

Eighth Day

Treatise of True Devotion to the Virgin Mary [49-54]

Mary's Part in the Latter Times

"The salvation of the world began through Mary and through her must be accomplished." (TD 49)

God wishes to reveal Mary, his masterpiece, and make her better known in these times, the latter or final days [that is, the time that follows the fulfillment of salvation history in Christ's Redemption].

St. Louis de Montfort provides **seven reasons** (*TD 50*):

- 1. Because she kept herself hidden in this world and in her great humility considered herself lower than dust, having obtained from God, his Apostles and Evangelists the favor of not being made known.
- 2. Because, she is the masterpiece of the hands of God, both in the order of **grace** and in that of **glory**.
- 3. Because she is the dawn which precedes and announces the Sun of Justice, Jesus Christ, she must be known and acknowledged so that Jesus may be known and acknowledged.
- 4. Since she was the way by which Jesus Christ first came to us, she will again be the way by which he will come to us the second time though not in the same manner.
- 5. Since she is the sure means, the direct and immaculate way to Jesus and the perfect guide to him. He who finds Mary
