The preparation will consist in following the method of St. Louis Marie Grignion de Montfort, a missionary from France who wrote and left to the Church a valuable "Treatise on True Devotion to Mary Most Holy", a method followed by many Christians and even many saints.

For greater fruit of this consecration and to become a true slave of the Blessed Virgin Mary, in imitation of Jesus Christ, you should dedicate joyfully and very liberally about ten minutes a day to two points:

- The first is to consider a part of the Treatise on True Devotion, which we are going to indicate to you.
- The second point consists in preparing oneself with the consideration of some texts and in the recitation of some prayers that we will propose to you, always following the wise counsels of St. Louis Marie.

In conclusion, those who wish to embrace this particular form of devotion, after having spent at least twelve days in freeing themselves from the spirit of the world, contrary to the spirit of Jesus Christ, will dedicate three weeks to fill themselves with Jesus Christ through the Blessed Virgin Mary.

There are few minutes that will be dedicated to the points already mentioned, so you should seek the maximum possible recollection. Keeping always in mind that the fruit of this consecration is a weapon that God gives to those He wants to save....

If many will embrace this True Devotion, we may well hope that Jesus will truly reign in the world. Such a kingdom can only be realized together with His Mother.
