

On this first Sunday of Lent we are asked to consider the reality of temptation in our life. Jesus in the desert is tempted. Now this very fact should teach us that the mere fact of being tempted is not a sin. Sometimes people do think they are already sinning

when something bad occurs to them. This is not necessarily so since Jesus was tempted but never sinned. Jesus is tempted in three basic ways. The first is PLEASURE. The devil tells him to turn stones to bread, to satisfy his hunger, to reach for creature comforts and pleasure. Jesus rebukes this by quoting the scripture that says that we do not live by bread alone. In other words that there is more to life than mere pleasure. Next, he is tempted by POWER AND POPULARITY. The devil shows him all the kingdoms of this world and promises him that all the notoriety and power of being a king would be his. Here too Jesus rebukes this by declaring that the most important thing is to be loved by God and to love him. Finally, Jesus is tempted to PRESUMPTION. The devil tells him to do something risky and foolhardy and that no matter what God will save him. Jesus rebukes this by declaring that we have no business putting God to the test.

WHAT MAKES THIS JUBILEE YEAR SPECIAL AND WHAT SHOULD I DO?

Prayer changes things! In this Jubilee Year, our prayers and acts of mercy are especially powerful and fruitful. This is by a special favor from God who, every twenty-five years, gives extra graces and extends more abundant mercies to our prayers and works. Jubilee is about growing in trust of God. It is about pilgrimage. It is about forgiveness, restoration and redemption. Jesus says of Jubilee and his sovereign role in it:

The Spirit of the Lord is on Me, because He has anointed Me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent Me to proclaim liberty to the captives, and recovery of sight to the blind, to release the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

(Luke 4:18-19)

What's So Special?

It is a special year of the Lord's favor because every time you come to Mass here at Holy Comforter-St. Cyprian, you can gain special favor and indulgence from the Lord. This is especially so since this Parish is a declared Jubilee site by the archbishop.

Being designated as a "Jubilee Parish" entails additional dignity and responsibility, allowing pilgrims who are unable to travel to Rome due to time or financial constraints to visit and receive special blessings from the Lord. This special favor is known as an indulgence.

What is an Indulgence?

An indulgence is God's release of the temporal punishment for forgiven sins. Even after a sin is forgiven, it leaves lasting effects and wounds. These must be healed, whether in this life, or in purgatory. Purgatory is where souls of the faithful are cleansed of residual wounds of sin and fully healed.



A faithful Christian can assist this process by gaining an indulgence, a kind of "favor" for themselves or others, whether living or dead. This is carried out under specific conditions. These conditions are set by the Church which, as the minister of redemption, (see Mat 18:18-20), dispenses the treasury of the graces of Christ and the saints." An indulgence is partial or plenary (i.e. "whole"), as it removes either in part or in whole the punishment of sins, or brings needed healing due to sin."

How is this done?

The Church request four things be done to obtain a special favor or "indulgence" from the Lord:

- 1. **One** must form intention. This intention can be for oneself, or for others, whether living or deceased. It can also be for a certain outcome in this world, e.g. peace, healing of some other illness, or some worthy need.
- 2. **One must attend** Holy Mass and apply the fruits of their attendance to this intention. One can also engage in other pious activities such as praying the rosary, spending time in Eucharistic Adoration, saying novena prayers, making the Stations of the Cross, or attending a spiritual gathering such as a penance service, Sodality meeting, Holy Name meeting, or other such events.
- 3. One prays for the good intentions of the Holy Father in some explicit way.
- 4. One must go to confession within twenty days before or after this offering intention for the indulgence.

So, what should you do?

1. Before you come to Mass, or to pray, visit the Blessed Sacrament in adoration, or to attend any spiritual gathering or liturgy here, form an Intention as described in # 1 above. Consider putting it in writing: "I am going to pray for ..." When you arrive at our Jubilee parish you might consider writing your intention in an attendance book we will have in the vestibule.

- 2. Ask the Lord to apply the fruits of your attendance or action to your intention.
- 3. Go to confession within twenty days (preferably closer) before or after attendance or action.
- 4. Pray for the good intentions of the Holy Father. This is traditionally done by praying one Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory be." However, you can just pray in your own words or read a prepared text.

Will your indulgenced and favored intention be:

Plenary? (an indulgence that wholly removes wounds, effects, or punishments of sin)?

or

Partial? (an indulgence that helps substantially, but not completely).


That depends on a factor that is difficult to quickly meet. Namely, that one be in a state of grace, that is, free of mortal (sometimes called "grave") sin and that they be free of attachment to even venial sin. An attachment to sin means that we are still drawn to it or find it appealing in some way, or not all that bad. Being free of attachment means we hold mortal and even venial sin, in contempt, that we find it repulsive and would rather die that offend the Lord. This

condition is not easy since we are strongly inclined to many sins. Only over time and with much grace can many of us get to this blessed state of being free of attachments to all sin.

What this means is that you should try to obtain a plenary indulgence, realizing that, even if you are not free enough from all attachments to sin, you will gain a partial and substantial amount of God's grace. Consider too, in this jubilee Year of the Lord's special favor, even a partial indulgence will receive extra power and grace!

So go for it!

Never forget to form an intention before you come to this parish for any spiritual function, gathering or meeting. Never forget to offer the fruits of your participation and attendance to the Lord who will grant special favors in this year of Jubilee!




