Thirteenth Day

Treatise: of True Devotion to the Virgin Mary [90-95]

Marks of False and Authentic Devotion to Mary

In the last few meditations, we examined five truths of devotion (in Day 10, 11, 12). Now, that we have established these five basic truths, it is all the more necessary to make the right choice of the true devotion to our Blessed Lady, for now more than ever there are **false devotions** to her which can easily be mistaken for true ones. St. Louis Marie explains: "The devil leaves other devotions alone and counterfeits mostly those directed to Jesus and Mary."

Consequently, the saint will explain the false devotions to Mary in order to avoid them, and then, true devotion in order to practice it. Among so many different forms of true devotion to our Blessed Lady, we should choose the one most perfect and the most pleasing to her, the one that gives greater glory to God and is most sanctifying for us.

The saint continues by saying that he has found seven kinds of false devotion to Mary. [Today we examine two of them. We will consider the rest of them tomorrow.]

1) Critical devotees: These are proud scholars have a vague devotion to Mary, but they criticize all the practices of piety that simple people fulfill in a pious manner to honor their good Mother. They question all the miracles and stories, even those recorded by trustworthy authors, who demonstrate the mercy and power of the Blessed Virgin. When they are shown the honors that the Holy Fathers pay Mary, they respond by saying that they speak rhetorically or alter the interpretation. This kind of false devotees are very dangerous because they commit a grave injustice towards devotion to the Virgin Mary.

2) Scrupulous devotees: They are those who fear that, by honoring the Mother, the Son will be dishonored. They greatly regret that, in front of an altar of the Holy Virgin, there are more people kneeling than in front of the Blessed Sacrament, as if the two things were incompatible and as if those who pray to the Virgin Mary do not pray to Jesus Christ through her. There is some truth in what they say, but the inference they draw to prevent devotion to Our Lady is very insidious. It is a subtle snare of the evil one under the pretext of promoting a greater good. For we never give more honor to Jesus than when we honor his Mother, and we honor her simply and solely to honor him all the more perfectly. We go to her only as a way leading to the goal we seek—Jesus, her Son. The Church, with the Holy Spirit, blesses our Lady first, then Jesus, "Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus." Not that Mary is greater than Jesus, or even equal to him, but in order to bless Jesus more perfectly we should first bless *Mary*.

We have an immortal soul to save (From St. Alphonsus Maria de Ligori, Way of Salvation)

The enterprise of our eternal salvation is the most important undertaking. It brings us bliss or eternal damnation. This enterprise ends in eternity, that is, in salvation or eternal damnation: in obtaining an eternity of joy or an eternity of

torment: to live life forever happy or forever unhappy. Oh my God, what will become of me? Will I be saved or condemned? I may be saved or I may be lost. And if it is possible for me to lose myself, why do not I resolve to embrace a life that assures me of eternal life?

'And then? And after?' If everyone thinks of death, when everything is left behind; or on judgment, in which we will give an account of everything, a happy or unhappy eternity—according to each one of us. Then what?

I see, my God, that I have forgotten that my soul is immortal, neglecting the most important task of my life, exchanging it for futile little things. I regret, O Infinite Goodness, having turned my back. Today I resolve to surrender myself completely to you. And what do I expect? Maybe you will leave me, and death will find me miserable and ungrateful, according to how I've lived so far. No, my God, I do not want to give you more displeasure; I want to love you. Help me, Mary, my hope!

They pray many rosaries with great haste and participate in many Masses distractedly. All that appeals to them is the emotional aspect of this devotion, but the substance of it has no appeal at all. If they do not feel warmth in their devotions,

Exhortation to Trust

"Oh! You, whoever you are, who feel far from land, dragged by the waves of this world, in the midst of storms, if you do not want to capsize, do not take your eyes off the light of this Star.

If the wind of temptation rises, if the stumbling block of tribulations gets in your way, look at the Star, invoke Mary.

If you are unbalanced by the agitations of pride, of ambition, of murmuring, of envy, look at the Star, invoke Mary.

If anger, avarice, impure desires shake the fragile vessel of your soul, raise your eyes to Mary.

If, disturbed by the memory of the enormity of your crimes, confused before the awkwardness of your conscience, terrified by the fear of Judgment, you begin to let yourself be swept away by the whirlwind of sadness, to throw yourself into the abyss of despair, think of Mary.

In the dangers, in the anxieties, in the doubts, think of Mary, invoke Mary.

May her name never depart from your lips, never leave your heart; and to reach the relief of her intercession, do not neglect the examples of her life.

Following her, you will not get lost; praying, you will not despair; thinking about her, you will avoid all mistakes.

If she sustains you, you will not fall; if she protects you, you will have nothing to fear; if she leads you, you will not get tired; if she is favorable to you, you will reach the end. And so you will verify, from your own experience, how right it was said: *And the name of the Virgin was Mary*."
