Jesus Christ is the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead and ruler of the kings of the earth. To Him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his Blood, who has made us into a Kingdom, priests for His God and Father, to him be glory and power forever and ever. Amen. Behold, He is coming amid the clouds, and every eye will

see Him, even those who pierced Him. All the peoples of the earth will lament Him. Amen. 

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY is **April 27th**. Please join us next Sunday after the 11AM Mass to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet as a parish family in loving memory of our beloved Deacon Kevin Butler. Divine Mercy Sunday (Second Sunday of Easter) was instituted by Saint John Paul II calling it "the Sunday of Thanksgiving for all

goodness that God has shown us in the whole Easter mystery." The Divine Mercy devotion started in the 1930s by St. Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun who had a vision of Jesus in which He asked for devotions to His Divine Mercy on the Sunday after Easter. The Divine Mercy Chaplet is chanted or sung using the rosary. We will supply words to the chaplet and rosaries (limited supply). Come and see!

EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

April 2025

Dear Parishioners,

Early on a Sunday morning many centuries ago, Christ Jesus walked out of the tomb that the world had assigned to him and went to encounter the disciples he loved. It is still the case today. Jesus encounters us in every Mass, in every Sacrament, and in every gathering of the faithful. This on-going experience of the presence of the risen Lord is so essential to our well-being and to a proper vision for our life. Without it we are so easily overcome by the darkness and difficulties of this life!

Consider how the resurrection affected the first disciples. The Gospel of John appointed to Easter Sunday Morning is unusual in that it does not feature an actual appearance of the risen Lord. There is news of an empty tomb and a lot of running about by the women and apostles trying to figure out what has happened. The events take place just before and after dawn and so it is still rather dark. One can rightly say that it still hasn't "dawned" on them that Jesus is risen. To them, the empty tomb elicits thoughts of grave robbers, not resurrection!



All this may surprise us since Jesus had told them on numerous occasions that he would rise from the dead on the third day. Yet, it doesn't even occur to them as one possible explanation for the open and empty tomb. There are hints that St. John started connecting the dots, but even here, it is unclear. Resurrection light is shining but they seemed locked in the gloom of fear and the trauma of Good Friday. Their minds are weak in understanding and their memories are poor in recalling Jesus' own words, "but on the third day I will rise" (e.g. Luke 18:31).

But suddenly Jesus appeared to them in the upper room and their lives were forever changed. Their full transformation from fearful followers to courageous and joyful witnesses would wait till Pentecost, fifty days later. But already Jesus was shedding light and dispelling the darkness of their unbelief and negativity.

This most certainly needs to happen for us as well. We can become very locked in the tombs and prisons of our negativity and fear. It can become very difficult to see beyond the gloom of this world, especially in difficult moments. Thoughts of future glory and promising scriptures that all things work together for our good (Rom 8:28) seem a distant reality. But stay faithful fellow disciples to the discipline of Holy Mass and prayer and let the Lord increasingly form you in the joy and hope of a Christian who knows what this life is really all about. Crosses and seeming defeats will come, but for those who are faithful, these are just the birth pangs of unending and unspeakable joy. In three days we rise!

I treasure the relationship we have had over the many years as a parish family. Without you I would not be the priest and disciple I am today. You have taught me much and brought forth joy and confidence in me. So many of you have manifested a strong and enduring faith even in the midst of social injustices and persecutions past and present, and the sad tragedy of scandals in the very Church you love. Yet, in all of this you still found Christ in the Church and in the Sacraments. In all the setbacks and sorrows, you have chosen to rise with Christ and declare, "Trouble don't last always." We need always to remind each other of resurrection glory. I am grateful for your witness and testimony to me.

Christ is truly risen! Let us rise with him. Alleluia!

Altar Guild: Devoted to the care and cleaning of the sacred vessels and coordinates the liturgical supplies.

Servers: Youth who assist clergy and congregation in Liturgical celebrations.

Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist: Assists at Mass by distributing both species of Communion. Also, assist priests and deacons in serving the needs of the elderly, sick and homebound community.

Faith Formation/Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.): Provides catechetical teachings for new parishioners who are becoming Catholic or need further education of the faith.

Holy Name Society: A spiritual group of lay men dedicated to the praise and respect of the most Holy Name of God. Members are challenged to become models of hope, and make present in each individual their unique revelation of Christ as he continues his spiritual journey towards Christian manhood.

Knights of Columbus: Catholic men and their families dedicated and caring about; serving the church, community, country, and fellowman-working together for a better tomorrow.

Ladies of Charity: provides services to our parishioners/neighbors in need of food/clothing and other needs.

Sodality: Promotes a greater devotion to Our Lord through veneration of His Blessed Mother, and to provide a medium through which Sodalists may experience a deeper and more intimate relationship with God in their daily lives.

Sound & Recording Ministry: Set up/conduct sound mixing and recording and equipment prior to Sunday Mass, and special services when requested.

Ushers/Ministers of Hospitality (Adult & Youth): Greets parishioners and quests and assists them when they enter the church. They also manage the Candlelight Store.

Women's Ministry: Provides opportunities for women of HCSC parish and community to be ministered to spiritually, emotionally, physically and mentally through retreats, monthly fellowship and prayer partnership.

Youth Ministry: Assist youth with enhancing their spiritual growth; achieve academic excellence and provide opportunities to fellowship and grow in Christ.


